SAFETY INFORMATION FOR ALL DRIVERS

MBTA's South Coast Rail (SCR) will restore Commuter Rail service to southeastern MA in spring 2025. Until that happens, the MBTA will be testing trains to meet federally mandated safety requirements, followed by simulated service for another +/- 90 days. Trains will reach the approved maximum speed of 79 mph in many areas. The MBTA wants all drivers – particularly young ones who have not been familiar with grade crossings – to understand the rules of right-of-way (ROW) safety. Given the lack of experience with train service in the area, the MBTA is committed to offering robust ROW safety and education information.

Drivers should respect grade crossing signals. They should not stop on the tracks or drive around the gates.
