



2024 Fare Package Proposed Changes

The MBTA is committed to providing reliable, accessible, affordable transportation to all.

New Expanded Reduced Fare Eligibility for Income-eligible Riders

- The MBTA proposes implementing a new reduced fare program that will make all MBTA transportation, including The RIDE, available to income-eligible individuals.
- Eligible riders include those who are 26 - 64, participate in income-qualified state benefit programs such as SNAP and MassHealth.

‘Change Tickets’

- The MBTA proposes replacing current ‘change tickets’ on the Bus, Green Line, and Mattapan Line and transitioning riders to utilizing CharlieCards as a primary payment source.
- To facilitate the change, the MBTA will begin stocking blank CharlieCards onboard buses and at more locations around the network to encourage riders to load their cash onto CharlieCards.



Commuter Rail Weekend Pass Holiday Expansion

- The MBTA proposes making permanent the expansion of the \$10 Weekend Commuter Rail pass to include federal holidays.
